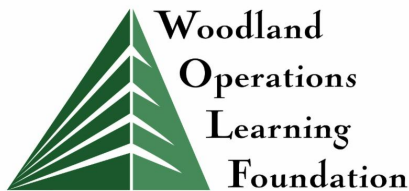

Forested Reclamation Record of Observations:

The course provides a practical guide to the application of the Record of Observation (RoO) tool for the *2010 Reclamation Criteria for Well Sites and Associated Facilities for Forested Lands*. WOLF certification will be provided to students successfully completing the course

Relevance:

Reclamation Certificate applications for sites submitted after January 1, 2012 must conform to the *2010 Reclamation Criteria for Well Sites and Associated Facilities*. All site assessments must use the 2010 RoO form. The course outlines a practical and professional approach to understanding and recording the required data in a consistent and repeatable process.

Audience:

Regulators, disposition holders, site construction contractors, reclamation consultants and contractors, Foresters, Forest Technologists, Biologists, Agrologists and anyone involved in the development and reclamation of well sites in Alberta will need to attend this course to stay current with the latest regulations and best management practices.

Location and Time:

Each session will run from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm for two consecutive days. Class-time, field practice and evaluation will be embedded in the courses.

Participants will benefit most if they bring a laptop or tablet that can work with Microsoft Excel (1997-2003 or later) spreadsheets. The latest 2010 Assessment Tool and RoO for Forested Lands will be forwarded to the students prior to the course presentation.

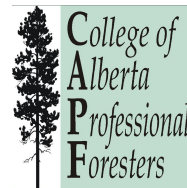
